



I Emergence

6 Gathering



8 Embarkation

As soon as the construction work was finished, the structure started radiating a luring chant, utterly irresistible for the Furless. They blissfully flocked to its source, and – miracle of miracles – the vessel seemed to easily accommodate all of them without ever getting overcrowded! The wild creatures who had worked so hard to manufacture the *B.U.D.* – watching the scene from a safe distance – didn't trust their eyes: 7.754.847.014 of the Fur less already found their way into it, and there were more to follow! Overwhelmed by their emotions, the animal beholders waved them goodbye with their handkerchieves.





9 Departure

After the very last of the Furless had entered the vessel, the gap in its hull closed. A bloodcurdling high-pitched howl shrilled through the night, followed by an incredibly bright flash of light. While all animals that were still nearby fled the site, the *B.U.D.* took off the ground, taking the Furless to a remote spot in the universe where they might persist self-sufficiently forevermore, kept from interfering with the fate of their former home planet ever again.

The structure is reminiscent of a lotus bud, a chapel and a futuristic spaceship at the same time. Inside, it contains a felt silhouette wall hanging a series of five small drawings and a video loop fog screen projection.

The wall hanging is depicting a march of protest signs carrying animal revenants who gathered to commemorate extinct plantal fellow creatures. This panoramic picture covers the whole visible part of the inner side of the textile hull of the spaceship.

Vis-à-vis to the wall hanging there is an octagonal column in the center of the structure. The series of drawings is integrated into that column. The single drawings are showing different events in a narrative about the alleged origins of the bud structure: A bud shaped divine creature of some kind commissions animalhood to construct a space vehicle which is supposed to take in mankind and carry it away from earth, to a better place.

The column is open to one side. From there, stairs inside the column are leading up to a “meditation capsule” located on a higher level. Up there, one is being confronted with the video loop fog screen projection: An approximately human head sized, ghostly, anthropomorphic light phenomenon variation of the lotus bud. It talks with an artificial sounding high pitched voice: “Don’t worry”, “Everything will be alright”, “Relax – you will be saved” and similar rallying calls are supposed to comfort the viewers and let them forget that they are supposedly on board of a vessel that will be going to remove them from earth forever.

Das Gebilde erinnert zugleich an eine Lotusknospe, eine Kapelle und ein futuristisches Raumschiff. In seinem Inneren birgt es einen Scherenschnitt-Wandbehang, eine fünfteilige Serie kleinformatiger Zeichnungen und einen auf Nebel projizierten Videoloop.

Der Wandbehang zeigt einen Demonstrationszug von Tier-Wiedergängern, die sich in Gedenken an ausgestorbene pflanzliche Mitlebewesen versammelt haben und protestierend Schilder in die Höhe halten. Dieses Panorama bedeckt den gesamten sichtbaren Teil der Innenseite der textilen Hülle des Raumschiffs.

Gegenüber dem Wandbehang befindet sich im Zentrum des Innenraums eine achtzellige Säule, in die die Zeichnungsserie integriert ist. Die einzelnen Zeichnungen zeigen Ereignisse in einer Erzählung über den angeblichen Ursprung des Knospenbauwerks: Eine Art göttliches Wesen in Knospenform gibt der Tierheit den Auftrag, ein Weltraumfahrzeug zu konstruieren, das die Menschheit aufnehmen soll, um sie von der Erde weg an einen besseren Ort zu transportieren.

Die Säule ist an einer Seite offen und bietet Zugang zu einer Treppe, über die eine höher gelegene, „Meditationskapsel“ betreten werden kann. Dort stehen die Betrachter:innen der Nebel-Videoloopprojektion direkt gegenüber: Einer etwa menschenkopfgroßen, geister-haften, anthropomorphen Lichterscheinung der Lotusknospe. Diese spricht mit einer artifiziell anmutenden künstlich erhöhten Stimme: „Don’t worry“, „Everything will be alright“, „Relax – you will be saved“ und ähnliche Durchhalteparolen sollen Betrachter:innen zuversichtlich stimmen und vergessen lassen, dass sie sich vermeintlich in einem Fahrzeug befinden, dass sie für immer von der Erde entfernen wird.
